


Promises To Abraham

- Many people were in existence by 2,000 B.C.
- Nations had already risen and fallen
- Pyramids had already been built
 - Egypt was being ruled by its twelfth dynasty



Abraham - Called to Serve

- Since Creation God blessed the righteous and showed disfavor to the wicked
- God chose one man to fulfill His purpose
 - He called Abram, later called Abraham and told him to leave his family and to go to a new land
 - Abraham (Genesis 17:5)
 - Go to a new land (Genesis 12:1)


Abraham - Called to Serve

- Ur of the Chaldeans
 - A city state of Sumer in the Mesopotamia Valley
 - He left his home in obedience to God (Hebrews 11:8-10)
 - Traveled approximately 600 miles until he reached Haran
 - Abraham's brother, Nahor, settled there permanently

Abraham – To Canaan

- Exact route that Abraham took from Haran to Canaan is uncertain
 - Probably traveled the trade routes of the day
 - At Damascus he had at least three choices

Abraham – To Canaan

- Probably took the King's Highway on the eastern side of the Jordan River.
- Most logical because his first camping place in the land was at Shechem located in the center of the land
- Most likely he moved south from Damascus until he reached the Jabbok River and then turning west and crossing the Jordan on to Shechem

Three Promises:

- ✓ Nation
- ✓ Land
- ✓ One who would bless all nations

Genesis 22:1-18 **Hebrews** 11:17-19



The entire remaining portion of the Bible is the story of the fulfillment of these three promises:

"the nation, the land, and the One who would bless all nations"

- Land was inhabited by a group of tribes called the Canaanites or the Amorites (Genesis 10:6,15-19)
 - They worshiped the gods of fertility called
 Baal with his female counterpart Ashtaroth


The entire remaining portion of the Bible is the story of the fulfillment of these three promises:


"the nation, the land, and the One who would bless all nations"

- Abraham's wealth consisted largely of cattle and sheep
 - Would move up and down the land


Abraham

- From Shechem, he moved between Bethel and Ai (12:8)
- He then moved farther south camping on the edge of the Negeb (12:9)
- A famine came in the land and Abraham went to Egypt (12:10), then later returned to Bethel






- Lot traveled with Abraham ever since they left Haran
 - Both were wealthy
 - Servants began to quarrel




- Abraham told Lot to choose the direction that he wanted to go
 - Chose the well watered valley of the Jordan
 - The evil cities of Sodom and Gomorrah were located in the plain that Lot chose and soon he was found living there


Abraham and Lot . Abraham moved




- Abraham moved south to a place called the Oaks of Mamre
 - Abraham is
 dwelling in tents
 on a plain named
 for one of the
 men living there



- On most maps it is known as Hebron
 - A town that grew up on that spot over time
 - Mamre and Hebron are one and the same place




- Egypt held nominal control over Canaan at this point in history – but played little role
- Four kings oppressed the cities near the Dead Sea (14:1)




- Battle in the Valley of
 Siddim at the southern
 edge of the Dead Sea
- Took people of Sodom and Gomorrah captive
 - Abraham and his confederates pursued the army to Dan and chased them to Hobah north of Damascus

Abraham



- Melchizedek, king of Salem met Abraham on his return from battle
 - Later called"U-ru-salem"meaning "a city ofSalem" or "a city ofpeace"
 - Later known asJerusalem

Abraham



- God made His promises to Abraham in the form of a covenant (Genesis 15)
 - His descendants –
 all the land from
 River of Egypt to
 the Euphrates
 River

Abraham, Ishmael and Lot


- Ishmael was born to Abraham through his concubine Hagar – Abraham was told God would bless Ishmael
 - However, he was not the son through whom the promises would be fulfilled
 - Abram's name was changed to Abraham (Genesis 17:5)

Abraham, Ishmael and Lot


- Angels visited Abraham by the Oaks of Mamre and he treated them well – they told him that he and Sarah would have a child
- The angels traveled to Sodom and Gomorrah on a mission to destroy it because of wickedness
 - Lot, who was living there fled to the nearby city of Zoar with his two daughters

Lot

- Lot's two daughters committed incest with their father and each had a son by him (Moab and Ammon)
 - One became the father of the Moabites and the other became the father of the Ammonites




Abraham




- Abraham moves south to the city of Gerar
 - Isaac was born
- Abraham later moves to a place called Beersheba
 - Years later
 Beersheba would be known as the place that marked the southern boundary of Palestine

Abraham and Isaac



- God told Abraham to sacrifice his son Isaac
 - Went to the region of Moriah (22:2)
 - Exact location of Moriah is unknown but is thought to be the mount where the temple was built many years later (2 Chron 3:1)

Abraham and Isaac



- Angel of the Lord stoppedAbraham before he killed him
- Returned toBeersheba andthen to Hebron




Conclusion


- The Cave of Machpelah
 - Abraham, Isaac, Rebekah, Leah, and Jacob would all be buried in this same cave with Sarah
- Abraham arranged for Isaac to take a wife from the region of Mesopotamia – not the daughters of the Canaanites
 - Rebekah came and found Isaac living in the Negeb (24:62)


- At some point in history, Abraham had six other sons by a concubine named Keturah
 - Their descendants joined forces with the Ishmaelites
 - The names Midianites and Ishmaelites are used interchangeably on different occasions (37:25, 28, 36)

Lesson 11 Genesis 25:11-50:26





- Isaac moved west to Gerar because of a famine
 - Told not to go to Egypt
 - He continued to prosper
- Later moved to Rehoboth because the men of Gerar grew jealous of him



- At Beersheba,
 Abimelech comes and makes a treaty with
 Isaac
 - He also made a treaty with Abraham some years earlier


- Isaac had twin sons named Jacob and Esau
 - Esau became a hunter
 - Jacob cared for the flocks
 - Esau married women of the land who were a grief to Isaac and Rebekah

- Esau was described as a "profane man" (Hebrews 12:13-16)
- Esau did not put emphasis on important matters (his birthright)
- Jacob deceived his brother and his blind father and received the blessing of prosperity usually passed from the father to the eldest son
- Esau threatened to kill his brother Jacob





- Rebekah helped Jacob escape to Padan-Aram (28:2), her brother Laban's home
- Jacob spent the first night in a village named Luz (renamed Bethel by Jacob)
 - God repeated the promises
 that He first made to
 Abraham and then Isaac





- Jacob worked 20 years for his uncle Laban
 - He left with four wives,
 eleven sons, one daughter,
 a host of servants, flocks,
 herds, and other
 possessions


- Jacob left secretly and Laban caught up with him on the plateau east of the Jordan river
 - Laban was instructed by God not to harm Jacob




- After an exchange of words, they made a covenant of peace
- Jacob named the region Galeed
 - Will now be referred to as Gilead
- Jacob continues his journey toward Jordan and the angels of God met him at Mahanaim



- Jacob was concerned that Esau would still want to kill him
 - Esau moved north from Edom (home of the Edomites)
 - Angel of God wrestles with Jacob the night before the brothers meet
 - Jacob's name is changed to Israel



- Esau meets Jacob with
 400 men but the
 brothers parted in peace
 - Esau to Seir
 - Jacob toward the Jordan
- Jacob settles for awhile in a city called Succoth (33:17)
- Later he crosses the Jordan and buys land at Shechem



- At Shechem, Jacob's daughter, Dinah was mistreated by a man named Shechem
 - Two sons tookrevenge anddestroyed the menof the village
- Jacob then moves his family to Bethel



- After leaving Bethel, heading south, his wife Rachel died giving birth to Benjamin
 - She was buried in a place that would later become Bethlehem (Ephrath)



- Jacob joins his father Isaac at Hebron
- Jacob's favorite child was the next to the youngest (Joseph)
 - Oldest son of Rachel
 - Very righteous man



- Jacob sent his sons northward to graze their flock
 - On one occasion,
 Joseph was sent to
 check on them
 thinking he'd find
 them at Shechem but
 he found them at
 Dothan



- The brothers were so jealous that they talked about killing Joseph
 - Reuben persuaded them not to kill Joseph
 - They threw him into a pit and then at the suggestion of Judah, they took him out and sold him to the band of Ishmaelite-Midianite merchants on their way to Egypt

- The brothers then deceived Jacob, making him think that his son had been killed by an animal
- The merchants then sold Joseph as a slave to a man named Potiphar

- Joseph was a faithful man and was able to interpret dreams
 - He gained favor with Potiphar and was put in charge of Egypt, second only to the Pharaoh
- A famine brought his brothers to Egypt unknowing that it was Joseph that they stood before

- 22 years had passed since they last saw each other
- Joseph eventually told them who he was and asked them to bring his father and all their families into Egypt
- Jacob led his family on a 200 mile trip to Egypt
 - At Beersheba he stopped and offered sacrifices to God

 A fertile section of land on the Nile Delta called Goshen was given to Joseph's family



- Jacob lived and prospered 17 years before his death
- Joseph received permission to carry his father's body back to the land of Canaan

- Joseph lived 66 years after the famine ended
 - When Joseph died, the Israelites could not ask permission to take him home to Canaan to bury him because they were now being oppressed under a different ruler
 - Joseph's body had to wait to be carried when Moses delivered the children of Israel out of Egypt
